It was really scary for us as he was our first child and we didn't know what to do.

Doctors suggested an emergency medical surgery and estimated a cost of Rs 1,50,000/-. Without giving any second thought we started gathering the money by taking out a loan and asking help from friends.

Now Pushpraj will undergo a second operation to strengthen his digestive system, and get the anus constructed to create an excretion system. The total cost of the treatment is Rs. 1,25,000/-.

I am a farmer, due to COVID -19 & climatic conditions, there has been no proper cultivation of crops. The fields are devastated and we are only able to earn Rs 5000 to 6000/- monthly. This is an enormous sum to collect by a poor person like me. We plead to all the people, please help us to save our son Pushpraj and complete his second surgery.

He was like an angel who saved our boy. If he hadn't completed the surgery on time we would have lost our son Rajesh. After 5 months, Rajesh underwent a second operation to strengthen his digestive system, and the anus was constructed to create an excretion system. The total cost of the treatment of Rs. 1,25,000/- was covered by the government scheme applied by the doctor on our behalf. We feel so blessed that our son's second surgery is also successful. If we didn't get help it would have been impossible. I am a farmer, due to COVID -19 & climatic conditions there has been no proper cultivation of crops. The fields are devastated and we are only able to earn Rs 3000 to 4000/- monthly. We have been surviving on the food provided by the distribution camps set up by NGOs or Trust's. But, soon, it was time for Rajesh's third surgery. The total estimated cost of treatment is Rs 1,00,000/- which is a big amount for poor people like me. We plead to all the people, please help us to save our son Rajesh and complete his third and final surgery (COLOSTOMY CLOSURE).

Progressive Genu Valgum Deformity'. She suffers from the worst disability, her hands and legs are crooked and it's been 12 years and she is still suffering. As a child, life has never

been easy for Rupali. Disability, poverty, and her father committing suicide have left this little girl child traumatized. "I was working on the field and suddenly I got the news, Pintu was no more! My husband committed suicide. I was widowed, my 3 children were left fatherless! That very moment our lives changed forever. He left me to bear all the pain alone. My in-laws asked me to leave and suddenly I had no roof on my head. With 3 children and no savings. But yes, my mother saved me and she supported me. But she also passed away. And I had to leave her house. I had no option but to turn to the street. I was never educated and I took up the job of security and shifted to Malegaon to earn INR.4000 a month. With this mere income, I'm struggling to make the ends meet. I am living in this tin house with my broken family. The roof leaks when it rains but my hopes don't wash away with it. I believe that one day Rupali will walk to me, not with a broken body but fulfilling my unfulfilled dream."

Karim's extended family members are the only support for his family who provides monetary help for their survival and Rohit's treatment. A month ago, he came home from school complaining of severe leg pain. We took him to the doctor, who prescribed him medications for 15 days. Unfortunately, there was no relief for him and the pain continued to increase. At our second appointment, the doctor suggested a sonography report. When the report arrived, it was found that he had been diagnosed with blood cancer. Following the reports, we immediately admitted him to the hospital & gave him a blood transfusion. We raised around Rs. 1,50,000/- from the sale of our household goods to pay for the blood transfusion. He was kept in the observation ward after the treatment & was discharged after 15 days. A few days later, he started experiencing leg pain again. In consultation with the doctor, he suggested Nashik or Mumbai Hospitals for Hasnen's further treatment. We visited HCG Manavata Cancer Centre in Nashik, Maharashtra. It was revealed in the new reports that not only did Hasnen have blood cancer, but also has a hole in his heart and a stomach infection. The news left us shocked and devastated. Our son is going through a lot of pain due to the infection. Hasnen's doctor warned that his stomach infection must be cured before he could get his blood cancer treatment, otherwise, there will be serious consequences. Hasnen's father is a daily wage worker and doesn't earn much so we took a loan of Rs. 2,50,000/- for the stomach infection treatment. Hasnen has been receiving his treatment for the past 3 days. The doctor has told me not to feed him anything & he is just surviving on water & glucose injected into his body. The treatment for Blood Cancer estimated by the hospital is around Rs. 5,00,000/- Already in debt of Rs. 2.5 lakhs it is next to impossible for us to gather such a huge amount. Our family's condition is much worse, as Sabir (Hasnen's Father) is off job and there is no source of income. We survive by eating from the tiffin provided by the hospital for the patient or sometimes we even sleep on an empty stomach. I request to everyone reading this, Please help us save our child, I don't want to lose him. You are the only support for Hasnen's treatment. ~ Rubina (Hasnen's Mother)





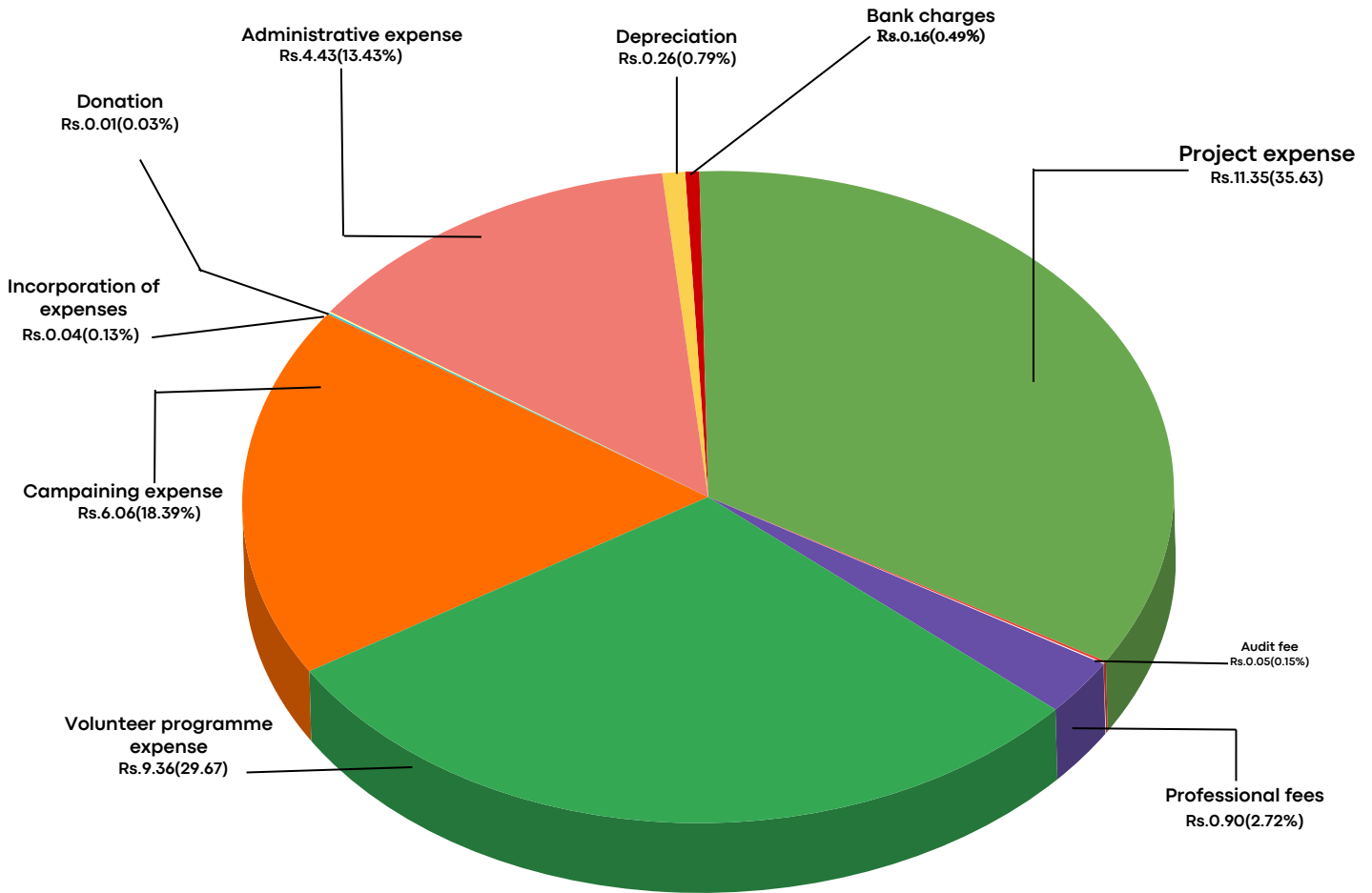
